	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Drone market to be worth £10b by 2030; this means investing in drones can be a huge profit making sector for Dominica and can save money in delivery drivers.- Carbon emissions reduced by 2.4m tons, meaning drones are better for the environment, which helps meet sustainability targets, and satisfies customers + the government.- Operators must maintain a line of sight meaning the drones cannot travel extremely large distances, or someone would need to follow the drone to where it's going, which defeats the purpose.- Regulations limit drones in residential areas, meaning drones cannot deliver straight to customers doors, which again defeats the purpose of having a drone to deliver.

	<p>number of children that would see these adverts, this may mean that Dominices may see less families going there there due to the lack of children asking their parents for Dominices, however this ban has yet to come into force.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- There is also a junk food tax placed on foods that are unhealthy, which will also mean less customers shopping at Dominices because, due to the cost of living crisis people cannot afford to shop there.- Corporation tax increased from 19% for 2023 to 25% to for 2024, which means that Dominices will be paying more tax to the government, which can reduce profits, and this may also prompt Dominices to set up operations in other countries with lower tax rates.- The Universal credit allowance increased in the past tax year. This This can mean that some people have more disposable income and may choose to spend this on fast food restaurants such as Dominices
