

Commentary on candidate evidence

The candidate evidence has achieved the following marks for each element of the assignment.

Candidate 5

The candidate was awarded **17 marks** because:

- ◆ I2 – Awarded at line 55 for two sentences giving relevant background to the question.
- ◆ I1 – awarded at line 56 for outlining the factors to be discussed: the young, old and workers in society.
- ◆ Ex1 – awarded at line 62 for explaining the impact of the free school meals act in ensuring that every school child got one free nutritious meal a day which was more than that they were getting at home.
- ◆ B1 – balance is credited at line 63 for the sentence explaining why the Free School Meals Act was not successful because children did not have enough to eat during the school holidays.
- ◆ K1 – awarded at line 66 for giving historical detail about the 1907 education act, introducing free medical inspections for children.
- ◆ The next sentence is not credited as this comment is repeated further on in the paragraph.
- ◆ Ev1 – awarded at line 71 for an extended comment, explaining the overall impact of the forms for the young in solving the problem of poverty.
- ◆ K2 – awarded at line 74 for a historical point on the problems facing older people.
- ◆ Ref1 – awarded at line 76 for a reference, citing the author and quote about the difficulty of older people having enough to eat.
- ◆ K3 – awarded at line 78 for a historical point, describing the financial support for all the people under the Old Age Pensions Act.
- ◆ Ev2 – awarded at line 84 for an extended comment on the success of reforms for all the people in relation to the overall impact in solving the problems of poverty.
- ◆ K4 and 5 – 2 knowledge points awarded at line 86 and line 88 describing the problems facing workers and the help provided by the liberal government with the introduction of the National Insurance Act.
- ◆ Ex2 – awarded at line 88, in the sentence explaining the impact of the help provided by the National insurance Act in giving money so that the worker could still provide for their family whilst sick.
- ◆ B3 – awarded at line 94 for balance within one factor, including three relevant factors.

- ◆ K6 – awarded at line 91 for the description of the Workmen’s Compensation Act.
- ◆ Ex3 – awarded at line 93 for a sentence explaining the impact of the Workmen’s Compensation Act on people who could now take time off to recover.
- ◆ B3 – The candidate had another opportunity to be awarded this mark at line 94.
- ◆ The remaining sentences do not gain any further credit, as they are repetition of previous comments.
- ◆ J1 – awarded at line 100 for a clear overall judgement on the question asked.
- ◆ SR – awarded at line 103 for giving several reasons, explaining the relative success of the liberal government reforms.
- ◆ The rest of the conclusion does not gain any further credit, as it is a summary of paragraph factors, however, their relative importance is not assessed by the candidate.
