

Commentary on candidate evidence

The candidate evidence has achieved the following marks for each question of this question paper.

Candidate 1

Question 34

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** because they provided three relevant source points. In this question the candidate quotes and interprets.

Marks awarded:

- ◆ MI 2 awarded for identifying “thoroughly examined by surgeons” and interpretation of this point.
- ◆ MI 3 awarded for identifying “put in punishment cells for rebellious behaviour” and interpretation of this point.
- ◆ MI 4 noted for identifying “kept chained up” and interpretation of this point. However, a maximum of three source points can be credited in this question.

Marks not awarded:

- ◆ Interpretation of ‘Source A is full in saying they were “forced to walk for many days.”’ The candidate has chosen the distractor sentence.
- ◆ No recall and no judgement. As per the marking instructions, a maximum of two marks may be awarded for answers in which no judgement has been made or which refer only to the source.

Question 35

The candidate was awarded **2 marks** because the candidate provides evaluative comments on authorship and one recall point.

Marks awarded:

- ◆ The candidate identifies and evaluates authorship and provides an explanation of usefulness.
- ◆ MI 3 is awarded for ‘Source B is not useful in saying that plantations took over the island. This meant that there was no room for other things’.

Marks not awarded:

- ◆ The candidate selects and interprets source point 1, but there is no explanation of usefulness.

- ◆ The candidate selects and interprets source point 2, but there is no explanation of usefulness.
- ◆ The candidate selects and interprets source point 3, but there is no explanation of usefulness.

Question 36

The candidate was awarded **4 marks** because the candidate provides four clearly explained reasons.

Marks awarded:

- ◆ MI 9 awarded for stating 'A reason for it being so hard for slaves to resist...carefully by people.'
- ◆ MI 1 awarded for stating 'Another reason for it being so difficult for slaves to resist...harsh punishments.'
- ◆ MI 9 awarded for stating 'Another reason for it being difficult to resist...nowhere for them to go.'
- ◆ MI 9 awarded for stating 'Another reason for it being so difficult for slaves to resist...limited in resources.'

Question 37 (b)

The candidate was awarded **8 marks** because the candidate provides an introduction, five knowledge marks, balance and an overall summary.

- ◆ Introduction
 - Credited for identification of two factors (loss of population and underdevelopment).
- ◆ Factor 1
 - MI 1 awarded for 'The first reason...people to then help develop Africa'.
 - MI 3 awarded for 'There was now a lot harsher...taken away as a slave'.
- ◆ Factor 2
 - MI 8 awarded for 'A reason is that villages...left... in Africa which led to underdevelopment'. BALANCE is awarded at this point as the candidate has introduced another factor.
- ◆ Factor 3
 - MI 5 is awarded for 'Another reason was that lots of the young strong...no fit people to do it.'
- ◆ Factor 4
 - MI 11 awarded for 'Another reason was that there were a lot of tribe leaders kidnapping...no one left to take.'
 - MIDP 11 awarded for 'Another reason was that there were now a lot more wars between tribes. This was not...longer than usual.'

- ◆ Conclusion:
 - Overall summary credited (1 mark).

Marks not awarded:

- ◆ No marks were awarded for their final paragraph as it refers to modern-day impact.
