

Commentary on candidate evidence

The candidate evidence has achieved the following marks for each section of the assignment.

Candidate 3

The candidate was awarded **17 out of 20 marks**.

Standard A

The candidate was awarded **4 marks**.

Points about the significance and impact of the issue are woven throughout the report, so this section achieves full marks.

Standards B, C and D

The candidate was awarded **8 marks**.

Ticks fell in the top column for all five statements, but also in the second column for use of sources as the report was felt to be more persuasive than discursive and therefore a bit lacking in balance. This means that although the detail and analysis were very strong, it could not be awarded a mark from the top of the range.

Standards E and F

The candidate was awarded **5 marks**.

There are clear concluding points after the sections on Utilitarianism and Islam, and at the end of the report, but the candidate's view can also be inferred in the opening sections. There is some repetition, so their conclusion is worth 5 marks.
